What is a TR Replication Site?

A Teen Responders Replication site is an officially endorsed host for Teen Responders workshops. These sites have been trained, equipped, and signed on to be a host site in-line with the mission and vision of Teen Responders.

What is does it take to become one?

There are a few things an organization must do in order to become an official Replication Site:

- 1. Attend a Replication Training Event (train the trainer)
- 2. Recruit at least 1 mental health professionals to help lead in your community
- 3. Sign the Contract, agreeing to meet and uphold certain expectations
- 4. Reporting post-workshop about how the event went
- 5. Pay the one-time fee: \$850 (funding and scholarships available)

What do I get out of it?

Once you have done the above steps, you will receive several things to help you be successful:

- 1. Training from the founders and current leadership of Teen Responders
- 2. A curriculum document that is ready to go and can be adapted to your context
- 3. Slides for all portions of the workshop
- 4. Logos and marketing material (handouts, videos, etc.)
- 5. A resource list, complete with links for where to purchase
- 6. Promotion of your event on the Teen Responders website and an official endorsement
- 7. Two 30-minute meetings with Teen Responders leadership for planning and problem-solving

- 2. Is there a person or a group from our organization that is willing to be the representative, who can drive the program as it goes along?
- 3. Do we have relationships in the community we can leverage to strengthen this program? If no, can we build them?
- 4. Specifically, do we think we'll be able to recruit a mental health professional to help with this work?
- 5. Are we interested in a one-time event or to do continual work?
- 6. What are our motivations for wanting to be a Teen Responders Replication Site?
